





ILO's Global Flagship Programme on Building Social Protection Floors for All

Third Meeting of the Multi-Stakeholder Partnership for SDG 1.3 24 October 2018, Geneva Room XI, R2

Objectives

- **Take stock** of the social protection situation, progress made in building sustainable social protection systems and floors and achieving SDG 1.3, and provide an update on the results and impact of the ILO's Global Flagship Programme on Social Protection Floors (SPFs)
- Look at current and future challenges and how countries and development partners can provide concrete and innovative answers notably through the ILO's Global Flagship Programme and existing networks of the Multi-Stakeholder Partnership for SDG 1.3
- **Join forces** to promote Universal Social Protection (#USP2030) and work towards the Centenary celebrations on social protection: "100 years of social protection at the ILO: the road to universal social protection"

Background information

Today 55 per cent of the World's population still has no social protection.¹

Faced with the urgency of the situation, the international community has committed, as part of the Agenda 2030, to "implementing nationally appropriate social protection systems and measures for all, including floors, and by 2030 achieving substantial coverage of the poor and the vulnerable (SDG 1.3)".

To support the achievement of SDG 1.3 the ILO has joined forces with other organizations as part of a **Multi-Stakeholder Partnership for SDG 1.3.** This partnership embraces all ILO member States committed to expanding social protection for all. It also includes UN agencies involved in the UN Social Protection Floors Initiative (SPF-I); the Social Protection Interagency Coordination Board (SPIAC-B); the Global Business Network for Social Protection Floors (GBN); workers' organizations part of the Social Protection, Freedom and Justice for Workers Network; civil society organizations actively involved in the Global Coalition for Social Protection Floors; foundations, academia and others. Many members of the partnership have already joined an ILO and World Bank initiative to promote Universal Social Protection (#USP2030).

To support the achievement of this ambitious target the ILO is implementing the <u>Global Flagship</u> <u>Programme on Building Social Protection Floors for All (2016-30)</u> that provides a structured and

systematic approach to supporting countries in the development of social protection systems and floors. Based on four pillars – country support, thematic support, knowledge development and partnerships – the ILO Flagship Programme has already achieved systemic changes in many countries with impact on millions of lives.

Our annual meeting of this year, held in **Geneva on 24 October 2018**, will be a unique opportunity for ILO member States and development partners to share progress made, experience and lessons learned in supporting and achieving SDG 1.3, and look at future challenges and opportunities as well as ideas for new collaboration.

The meeting will start with welcome remarks by **Mr Guy Ryder**, ILO Director-General and a keynote address by **Ms Michelle Bachelet**, United Nations High Commissioner for Human Rights.

The meeting will continue with a **high-level segment**, chaired by **Ms Deborah Greenfield**, ILO Deputy Director-General for Policy, with the participation of High-Level Representatives of ILO member States and the Multi-Stakeholder Partnership for SDG 1.3.

A signing ceremony with partners that have just joined or reaffirmed their support to the ILO Flagship programme will provide diverse examples of ways to engage with the ILO in building social protection systems and floors. ILO member States and development partners will also have an opportunity to present ongoing social protection projects and initiatives through "booths" installed in the coffee area.

As you know in 2019, the ILO will celebrate its 100th Anniversary. Our meeting on 24 October 2018 will be a special occasion for you to join and prepare with us the Centenary celebrations on social protection. Through the Centenary celebrations, we will look at the past 100 years of social security at the ILO and promote Universal Social Protection (#USP2030) for the future!

The closing remarks will be delivered by **Mr Heinz Koller**, ILO Assistant Director-General and Regional Director, Europe and Central Asia.
