# Le programme STEP

- Programme mondial de lutte contre l'exclusion sociale et la pauvreté du Département de la Sécurité Sociale du BIT.
- Initié en 1998, deux domaines d'intervention prioritaires:
  - L'extension de la protection sociale aux groupes exclus, en particulier dans le domaine de la santé;
  - Le développement d'une approche intégrée de lutte contre l'exclusion sociale au niveau local.
- Intervenant simultanément à plusieurs niveaux (local / national / international).
- STEP: un instrument opérationnel de la "Campagne Mondiale d'extension de la protection sociale et la couverture pour tous ", lancée en 2000.

# La stratégie de Step

- Création de partenariats et renforcement des réseaux existants:
   Alliance Internationale, AMIN, ACYM, la Concertation, etc.
- Développement de connaissances pour stimuler et promouvoir l'innovation comme un moyen de améliorer l'impacte:
  - capitalisation des pratiques dans le terrain ;
  - création de connaissances pour couvrir les manques de connaissances par la recherche et l'expérimentation;
  - partage de connaissances par la production et la diffusion de publications, la formation, des projets; des ateliers, etc.

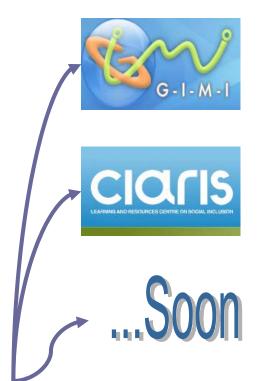

#### In Brief: The extension of social security in India

In recent years, the issue of social protection extension has gained a huge momentum while discussing at all levels the development agenda. The Government of India as well as the various state governments has demonstrated a wider awareness and stronger commitment to respond to the social protection needs of the presently excluded groups.

As a direct result, numerous actors of the civil society (community-based organisations, women's groups, trade informal economy trade unions, NGOs, microfinance institutions etc.) have already designed and set up in-house microinsurance schemes that were tailor-made to answer the priority needs and contributory capacity of their target groups.

Several international instruments affirm that every human being has the right to social security. Today only one of five people in the world has adequate social security coverage, while half of the world's population is without any social security protection at all.

Social protection is an important tool to prevent poverty, and strengthen the capacity to go out of poverty. The absence of social protection leads to greater chances of falling into poverty or remaining stuck in a poverty trap. Social security has also strongly suggested to contribute to economic growth by raising labour productivity and enhancing social stability.

Extending social protection to the whole population in the world represents a considerable challenge, both from a political and financial point of view as from a technical and institutional view.

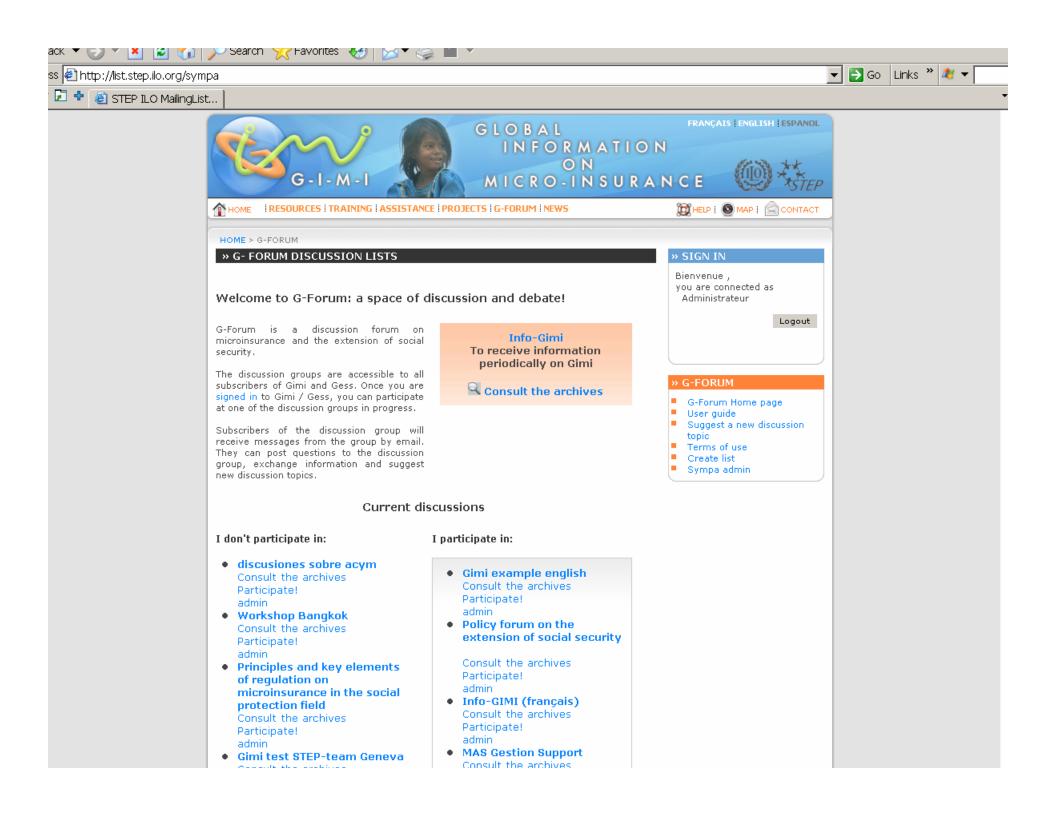

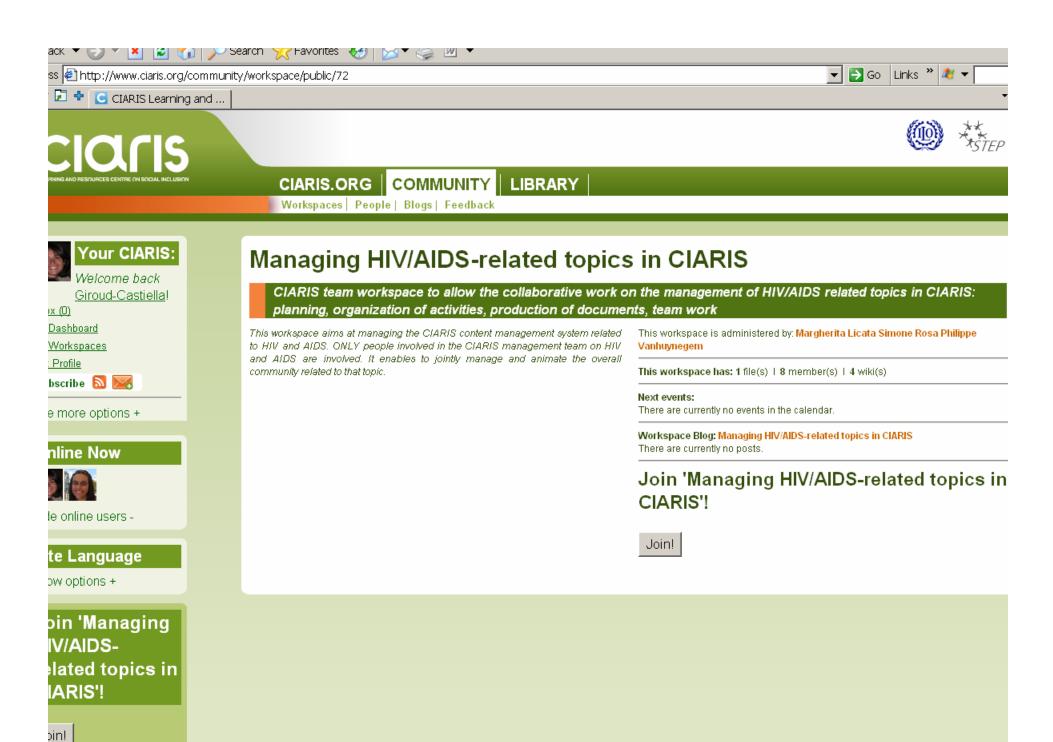

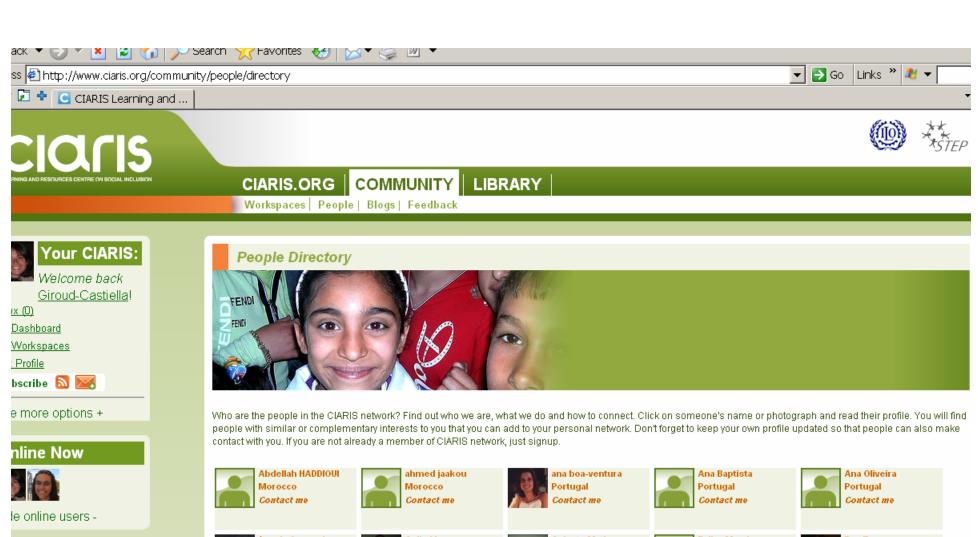
